 - Secure the fiber in place; no curing is required.
 - Test for optical performance. This method is faster but slightly higher in insertion loss compared to fusion splicing .

3. Epoxy-and-Polish Method

- Purpose: Factory-style termination for permanent connectors.
- Process:
 - Strip the fiber and clean it thoroughly.
 - Inject epoxy into the connector ferrule and insert the fiber.
 - Cure the epoxy using heat.
 - Polish the fiber end to achieve a smooth, flat surface for optimal light transmission.
 - Assemble the connector housing and perform optical and physical tests to verify performance .
